

POLICY & ADVOCACY WORKGROUP UPDATES FEBRUARY 2023

Public Charge

The U.S. Supreme Court denied the final appeal filed by the Texas-led case challenging new Public Charge rule. The new rule was effective as of December 23, 2022.

Asylum: Title 42 and Transit Ban

On Jan 5th the Biden Administration announced the expansion of Title 42 to include expulsions for individuals from Nicaragua, Haiti, and Cuba.

- This includes an agreement with the Mexican government to permit 30,000 expulsions per month from Venezuela, Nicaragua, Haiti & Cuba. A new parole program will to be made available for 30,000 total individuals from these countries per month.
- See statements denouncing this policy from the <u>American Immigration Council-AIC</u>, <u>National</u> <u>Immigration Law Center-NILC</u> and <u>Physicians for Human Rights-PHR</u>.
- ACTION ALERT: <u>American Immigration Council sign-on</u> to urge DHS Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas to support the pilot case management program for those seeking asylum in the U.S.

The Biden Administration also revived the Trump-era "transit ban" that bars those who crossed a third country from seeking asylum in the U.S. Previously, in 2020, the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals blocked the Trump Administration's attempt to apply the transit ban, but it was later vacated by the D.C. District Court.

- ACTION ALERT: The administration announced that a new proposed rule would soon be published by DHS and DOJ for public comment.

USCIS Application Fees

On Jan 4th USCIS announced a proposed rule that would increase application fees for naturalization, family-sponsored and employment-based visas, and other immigration benefits. The public comment period closes on March 6, 2023.

The Welcome Corps

On Jan 19th the Biden Administration announced a new <u>private refugee sponsorship program</u> that allows U.S. citizens and permanent residents to sponsor an individual to enter the U.S. as a refugee. The Welcome Corps is described as a service program to complement to the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program. Afghan Humanitarian Parole Program

Congress passed <u>H.R 2617 Consolidated Continuing Appropriations Act, 2023</u> to extend the eligibility period for Afghan humanitarian parolees to Sept 30th. Afghan humanitarian parolees are only eligible for ORR benefits and services if they enter with parole between Jul 31, 2021 and Sept 30, 2023. Groups who are exempted from this rule include (a) spouses or children of ORR-eligible Afghan humanitarian parolees and (b) parents/legal guardians of ORR eligible unaccompanied refugee minors.
